

A SPIRITUAL DROP FROM OUR PASTOR

XXVIII SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 12th, 2025

We are all painfully aware of the terrible wars ravaging various countries around the world, such as Gaza and Ukraine. Pope Francis repeatedly reminded us that we are in a "piecemeal" Third World War, while the Vatican Secretary of State recently stated that we are on the brink of a Third World War. Alongside these wars, we see that violence and religious persecution are growing at alarming rates in many countries. Tragically, this leaves our world more fragile and less safe. The very place that God created for us to live in peace has become marked by its opposite.

It is our duty as Christians not only to pray unceasingly for peace but also to live as peacemakers, striving to become men and women of peace. Yet we must remember that true peace begins at home. I am not talking about the house where we live, but the home of our hearts - there, in the depths of our being, we can create both good and evil, healing and harm. Let us strive each day to be kind; may our gestures, our gaze, our voice, and our words not be weapons that hurt those around us. Do we truly believe that Jesus is pleased when we pray for peace in the world, but fail to be peacemakers in our own families, friendships, and communities? Let us then begin where peace truly starts: in our hearts. From there, God's grace can radiate outward to heal our homes, our communities, and, in time, our world.





Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Each year, on the second-to-last Sunday in October, Catholics around the globe celebrate World Mission Sunday, a time of prayer and giving to support the missionary work of the Church. On the weekend of October 18-19, every parish in every country in the world will take up a collection to fund the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which supports 1,124 mission territories in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Europe. These are regions where the Church is still young, growing, and often facing poverty, conflict, or persecution.

The theme of this year's collection is "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples." Pope Leo chose this theme in reference to the Jubilee Year of Hope. He reflected on its meaning in his letter for World Mission Day:

"Through his disciples, sent to all peoples and mystically accompanied by him, the Lord Jesus continues his ministry of hope for humanity. He still bends over all those who are poor, afflicted, despairing and oppressed, and pours 'upon their wounds the balm of consolation and the wine of hope' (Preface "Jesus the Good Samaritan"). Obedient to her Lord and Master, and in the same spirit of service, the Church, the community of Christ's missionary disciples, prolongs that mission, offering her life for all in the midst of the nations. While facing persecutions, tribulations and difficulties, as well as her own imperfections and failures due to the weakness of her members, the Church is constantly impelled by the love of Christ to persevere, in union with him, on her missionary journey and to hear, like him and with him, the plea of suffering humanity and, indeed, the groaning of every creature that awaits definitive redemption. This is the Church that the Lord always and for ever calls to follow in his footsteps: 'not a static Church, but a missionary Church that walks with her Lord through the streets of the world' (Homily at the Concluding Mass of the Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, 27 October 2024)."

The funds raised in this collection foster the proclamation of the Gospel, the building of churches and schools and the provision of food and medical care in vulnerable communities. It is good to remember that the Church in the United States was once a mission territory and would never have grown as it did without the support of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Between 1822 and 1908, American dioceses received the equivalent of more than \$250 million in today's dollars to build parishes, schools, and seminaries. How beautiful it is that the Church in our country now has the opportunity to extend the same kind of financial support that was once bestowed upon us.

I would be grateful if you would keep the Church's missionary efforts in your daily prayers and give generously to this important collection, which serves the spiritual and material well-being of so many of our brothers and sisters throughout the world.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Cada año, el penúltimo domingo de octubre, los católicos celebran el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, un tiempo de oración y donaciones para apoyar la labor misionera de la Iglesia. Durante el fin de semana del 18 y 19 de octubre, todas las parroquias de todos los países del mundo realizarán una colecta para financiar la Sociedad para la Propagación de la Fe, que apoya a 1124 territorios de misión en Asia, África, las Islas del Pacífico y partes de Latinoamérica y Europa. Estas son regiones donde la Iglesia aún es joven, está en crecimiento y a menudo enfrenta pobreza, conflicto, o persecución.

El tema de la colecta de este año es «Misioneros de la Esperanza entre todos los pueblos». El Papa León eligió este tema en referencia al Año Jubilar de la Esperanza y reflexionó hermosamente sobre su significado en su carta para la Jornada Mundial de las Misiones de este año:

«El Señor Jesús continúa su ministerio de esperanza para la humanidad por medio de sus discípulos, enviados a todos los pueblos y acompañados místicamente por Él; también hoy sigue inclinándose ante cada persona pobre, afligida, desesperada y oprimida por el mal, para derramar sobre sus heridas «el aceite del consuelo y el vino de la esperanza» (*Prefacio "Jesús, buen samaritano"*). Obediente a su Señor y Maestro, y con su mismo espíritu de servicio, la Iglesia, comunidad de los discípulos-misioneros de Cristo, prolonga esa misión ofreciendo la vida por todos en medio de las gentes. La Iglesia, aun teniendo que afrontar, por un lado, persecuciones, tribulaciones y dificultades, y, por otro lado, sus propias imperfecciones y caídas, a causa de las fragilidades de sus miembros, está impulsada constantemente por el amor de Cristo a avanzar unida a Él en este camino misionero y a acoger, como Él y con Él, el clamor de la humanidad; más aún, el gemido de toda criatura, en espera de la redención definitiva. Esta es la Iglesia que el Señor llama desde siempre y para siempre a seguir sus huellas; «no una Iglesia estática, [sino] una Iglesia misionera, que camina con el Señor por las vías del mundo» (*Homilía en la Santa Misa al finalizar la Asamblea general ordinaria del Sínodo de los Obispos*, 27 octubre 2024).»

La colecta del Domingo Mundial de las Misiones fomenta la proclamación del Evangelio, la construcción de iglesias y escuelas, y la provisión de alimentos y atención médica en comunidades vulnerables. Es importante recordar que la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos fue una vez un territorio de misión y nunca habría crecido tan rápido sin el apoyo de la Sociedad para la Propagación de la Fe. Entre 1822 y 1908, las diócesis estadounidenses recibieron el equivalente a más de 250 millones de dólares actuales para construir parroquias, escuelas y seminarios. Es maravilloso que la Iglesia en nuestro país tenga ahora la oportunidad de brindar el mismo tipo de apoyo financiero que una vez se nos brindó.

Les agradecería que mantuvieran en sus oraciones diarias los esfuerzos misioneros de la Iglesia y donaran generosamente a esta colecta importante que sirve al bienestar espiritual y material de tantos hermanos y hermanas nuestros en todo el mundo.
